The Houston City Council reconvened at 9:00 a.m., Wednesday, May 13, 2026, Mayor John Whitmire presiding with Council Members Amy Peck, Tarsha Jackson, Abbie Kamin, Carolyn Evans-Shabazz, Fred Flickinger, Tiffany D. At 9:05 a.m., Mayor Whitmire called the meeting of the Houston City Council to order and moved to the Mayor's Report.

MAYOR'S REPORT

For the Mayor's Report, Mayor Whitmire thanked Commissioner Garcia for collaborating on the Near Northside where there was a groundbreaking on Quitman in front of Northside High School. He also thanked Director Randi Macchi, Houston Public Works, for their continued work on improving neighborhoods with \$48M in drainage street mobility projects. He also wanted to mention the contract that was agreed to on yesterday regarding SEIU. We can all celebrate our lowest paid public servants,

who have been overlooked for several years, received an immediate \$5 increase along with backpay for one year. Next, Mayor Whitmire introduced Juan Garcia, Chairman of Harris County Houston Sports Authority, Ryan Walsh, CEO of HCHSA, and Chris Canetti, President of the Houston Host Committee, to present a PowerPoint presentation to members of Council about the upcoming 2026 FIFA World Cup.
