A regular meeting of the Houston City Council was held at 2:00 p.m., Tuesday, July 7, 2026, Mayor John Whitmire presiding with Council Members Amy Peck, Tarsha Jackson, Joe Panzarella, Tiffany D. Thomas, Fred Flickinger, Mario Castillo, Joaquin Martinez, Edward Pollard, Martha Castex-Tatum, Julian Ramirez, Willie Davis, Twila Carter, Alejandra Salinas and Sallie Alcorn; Randy Zamora, First Assistant City Attorney, Marta Crinejo, Agenda Director, and Troy D. Lemon, City Secretary, present. Council Members Carolyn Evans-Shabazz and Mary Nan Huffman absent on personal business.
